Howard A. Rusk, born in Brookfield, graduated from the University of Missouri and went on to practice and teach medicine at Washington University Medical School in St. Louis. He later became known as the father of rehabilitative medicine because of his work to help people with injuries and disabilities.

In 1920, the Kansas City Monarchs baseball team was a charter member of the Negro National League. The team was active until the full integration of baseball in the 1950s. • The Rotoscope

The Rotoscope is a single camera, single projection system that is capable of taking and projecting a scope of 180 degrees on one reel of film. The inventors of the Rotoscope, Rowe Carney and Tom Smith, entered a new frontier of film technology with their 180 degree single camera and projector system.

The Pacific Railroad was the first rail line to reach Phelps County and the city of Rolla. Construction of the route halted with the onset of the Civil War leaving Rolla as the last stop on the line before the frontier of southwest Missouri.

Springfield

Elsey Carriage Company Photographs

The collection contains original photographs of vehicles built by the Elsey Carriage Company from 1905 to 1927. Grant Ellis Elsey and his company produced wagons and motorized vehicles for Springfield businesses between 1905 to 1968. Elsey built the first wagon used by the Springfield Fire Department, as well as ambulances and hearses. He also built the first motorpowered milk wagon in Springfield in 1910.

Balsley was a founding member of the Newspaper Food Editors Association, which helped establish a code of ethics for food journalism. Nuclear Weapons Freeze Campaign Records

This group advocated for the bilateral nuclear weapons freeze between the United States and the Soviet Union. Although the political elite at the time scoffed at the idea, scholars have recently discovered that the Freeze Campaign influenced the Reagan administration and contributed to the thawing of relations between the United States and the Soviet Union regarding nuclear weapons policy.
